## Safer Neighbourhoods team priorities:

1. Reducing the number of burglaries to sheds and outbuildings.
2. Reducing the number of thefts from vehicles parked at New Forest beauty spots.

These are the priorities that people in your local area have agreed with the Safer Neighbourhoods team. You can influence these priorities by contacting us or attending a meeting.

### Crime Summary:

The number of reported incidents decreased again in December, falling to 67.

### Assault: 2

One of these incidents involved a local residential establishment in Winsor and the other was as a result of a domestic dispute at Ower.

### Criminal Damage: 2

Damage was caused to several windows of vehicles parked in a locked compound in Cadnam. In a separate incident, damage was caused to a window in a front door at Ower following a domestic dispute.

### Dwelling Burglary: 3

Unfortunately, following several months of no dwelling burglaries in our area there have been three this month. One was at an isolated unoccupied cottage in Minstead where entry was gained via a lower ground floor window. Another was an isolated detached house in Ower where jewellery was stolen. The third was in Cadnam where a premises was entered overnight via an insecure conservatory window. Cash, electrical items and car keys were stolen. The offenders attempted to drive away with the car but failed.

### Non Dwelling Burglaries: 2

An unlocked shed on farm premises at Winsor was entered overnight before Christmas and six turkeys were stolen. A shed used as an office in Ower was broken into and cash and a credit card were stolen. Suspects have been identified and are currently being sought.

### Theft: 4

There were four thefts in the area. Two involved drive-offs from a petrol station in Ower and one which involved a male stealing golf clubs from a local golf club. Also, a BBQ was stolen from a caged area that was left unlocked and unattended at the hall at Copythorne.

### Theft from Motor Vehicle: 7

There have been more thefts from vehicles parked around the Forest. This has mainly happened to vehicles parked in pub/restaurant car parks and items such as Sat Navs and newly purchased Christmas presents were stolen, which had been left on view. Theft has also occurred at the car park at Fritham, where a handbag was removed from the boot of one vehicle and another had a Nintendo DS taken which had been left on view. Once again, please do not leave any valuables in your cars.

### Road Traffic Incidents: 15

Police attended and dealt with 15 separate road traffic incidents across the area this month. Four of these incidents involved animal death or injury on Forest roads. There was an incident on the A31 when a driver fell asleep and hit a telegraph pole, causing the road to be closed. Several incidents occurred during the very icy spell just before Christmas, with a number of vehicles losing control due to the difficult driving conditions. Fortunately, none of these resulted in serious injury but, with further cold spells forecast, drivers are reminded to drive responsibly and only if absolutely necessary.
