There were 71 reported incidents in April.

### Incidents of note:

#### Assault

An assault on a police officer took place following an arrest for a positive breath test. The man became violent and resisted arrest, assaulting the officer in the process. He was detained and is being dealt with for the offences.

Another assault was as a result of an argument between two 11 year olds, one of whom hit out at the other in Bartley. Apologies were made and so no further action will be taken.

The other assault was reported at a local residential establishment.

#### Dwelling Burglary

Once again, we have had a month free of dwelling burglaries. However, please remain vigilant, report anything suspicious or out of the ordinary and continue to ensure that your

property is left secure with all windows and doors locked and all keys left out of sight.

#### Non Dwelling Burglary

A caravan left in storage on a farm on the A36 road in Ower was entered and three DVDs were stolen. This incident occurred at some point since October 2009.

#### Criminal Damage

Damage was caused to the rear light of a vehicle in Bartley. This happened overnight on April 25-26. Also two reports of damage were received from a local residential establishment and are currently being investigated.

#### Thefts from vehicles

Thefts from motor vehicles are still occurring in the area, with offenders smashing windows to steal items from vehicles. This month they have mainly occurred in the Fritham and Bramshaw car parks again, where people have either left their valuables on display or have been watched depositing their valuables in the boot or under seats. A handbag was stolen from an unlocked vehicle in the car park of an equestrian centre at Ower and registration plates were stolen from vehicles parked in a car park at Tatchbury Mount.

**Please do not leave valuables in your vehicles when they are left unattended.**

#### Road Traffic Incidents (RTIs)

Police have attended and dealt with six separate RTIs this month across our area. None involved any animal death, although a dog was hit but not injured in Bartley. Two involved minor injuries at Cadnam and on the A36 at Ower. There were also three 'damage only' accidents at Ower.
